11:00am – 11:45am	<p>Chair: Brenda Happell</p> <p>Shifting culture, leading change</p> <p>Keynote Speaker: Professor Julie Repper, Programme Director - ImROC (Implementing Recovery for Organisational Change), University of Nottingham and Recovery Lead, Nottinghamshire Healthcare Trust</p> <p>Recovery focused values offer a framework for mental health nursing that is explicitly based on the wishes and preferences of people with lived experience of mental health challenges. This paper will discuss the meaning of these values and how they can influence and improve the roles, relationships, practices and politics of mental health nurses whether they are working in practice, research, management or leadership positions.</p> <p>Since nurses are the professional group who spend most time with people using services, and they are most closely involved with multiple aspects of their lives, they are also their natural allies, confidantes, supporters and advocates in services. It is through their experience of being with people, working with them to find ways forward in times of distress, sharing decision making, problem solving, planning ahead and building resilience, that nurses build expertise and bring real credibility to their leadership.</p> <p>Not only do recovery values and skills translate effectively into transformational leadership as an approach for changing cultures, but hard won skills in coproduction and collaboration at an individual level are essential for partnership developments at service and organisational levels.</p>	Plaza Auditorium Plaza Level

What special contribution do mental health nurses make to health services? Where are the opportunities for mental health nurses to lead health care provision for people with mental health issues? These are issues that need to be continually addressed in order to advance cultural change in health care provision. In relation to recovery-focused services, Bonney and Stickley (2008) put forward a challenge that “nurses’ thinking about recovery requires a deconstruction of past and current thinking around mental illness and the role of the nurse and work towards becoming a navigator or facilitator along the way of another’s journey as lives become reconstructed”.
